## **PURPOSE OF CIRCULAR:**

To advise law enforcement officers that British Columbia will continue to accept load securement practices outlined in the load securement standard which was included with the earlier Circular dated March 30, 2000.

## **BACKGROUND**

In the earlier circular No. 6 dated March 30, 2000, ICBC had accepted these load securement practices as outlined for a trial period of 12 months until March 31, 2001.

The final rule of the proposed Uniform North American Load Securement Standard has not yet been published. In the meantime, ICBC will continue to support this load securement procedure until the Uniform Standard is enacted as it has proven successful during the trial period and best represents safe operating practices by the industry.
